The imposition of a cross, marked with ash from last year's palm crosses, is an ancient symbol of penance and we should 'wear' it with pride that we are announcing our Christian faith and our Catholicity. Ash Wednesday is also a day of fasting and abstinence, the beginning of the penitential season of Lent.
